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Drug misuse;

Drug abuse;

Happens when drugs, including alcohol, illicit drugs or any other psychoactive substances are misused to get high or inflict self-harm. It also known as substance use disorder(SUD)

The highest prevalence of opium and its derivatives use was in the province of Kerman.

In relation to cannabis, the highest percentage of consumption was related to East Azarbayjan.

The highest prevalence of Amphetamine stimulants was in Sistan and Baluchistan

The most prevalent use of sedative drugs was related to Kerman.

Concerning consumption of alcoholic beverages, the highest prevalence rate was in Tehran.

Top 3 used drugs in Iran



Opium

Is a highly addictive non synthetic narcotic that is extracted from the Poppy plant, Papaver somniferum.

Cannabis

Marijuana, which can also be called Cannabis, weed, pot or dope, refers to the dried flowers, leaves, stems and seeds of cannabis plant.



It is depressent drug that slows down the messages travelling between the brain and body.

Alcohol

Side effects

Opium

Nausea, difficulty sleeping, allergic reaction, depression, fast heartbeat, blurred vision

Cannabis

Brain disorder, heart diseases, mental health, lungs, unintentional poisoning

Alcohol

- Loss of coordination, memory loss, alcohol
- poisoning, headache, vomiting, anxiety





Addiction in Healthcare professionals(HCP)


Doctors and nurses can be effected by addiction just like anyone else. if let untreated, this can lead to many negative effects for medical professionals and patient alike.

Studies in US have shown that 10-15% of HCPs will misuse substances during their lifetime. The rates of prescription drug abuse and addiction are 5 times higher among physicians than General population.


WITH SPECIALLY HIGH RATES OF; BENZODIAZEPINES AND OPIOIDS ABUSE

Self-medication

HCPs represent a profession that is particulary at risk of self-medication, especially with pain medications. Among doctors who misuse medications, 69% are male, have a history of self-medications and are coping with stress may lead to addictive behaviors.

Volunteering often to administer Narcotics to patients




Extreme financial, relationship or family stress
